

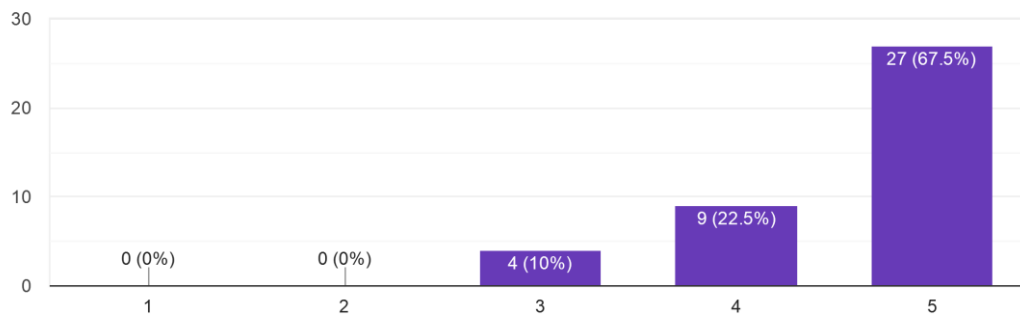

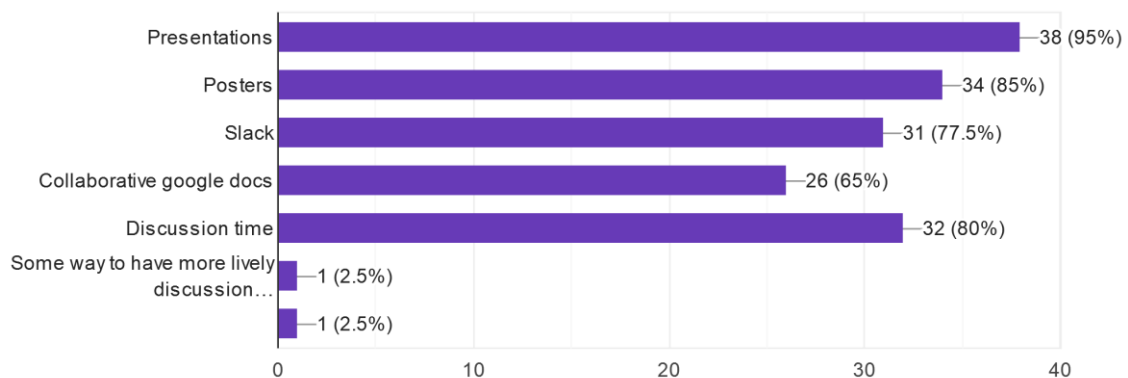
Overall how would you rate this workshop?

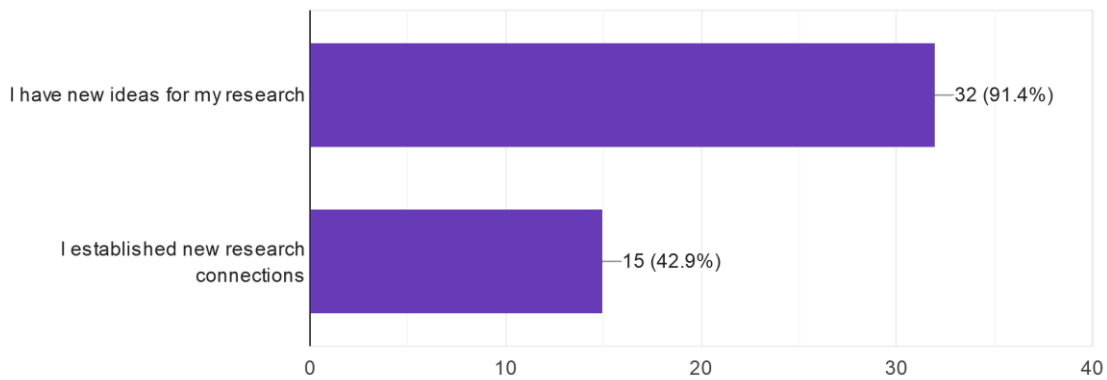


Which aspects of this workshop should return in future editions?

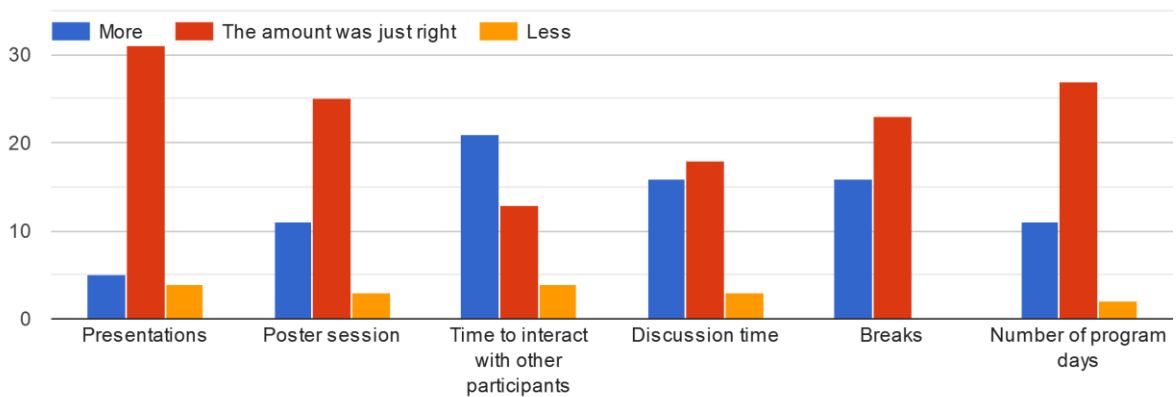

35 responses

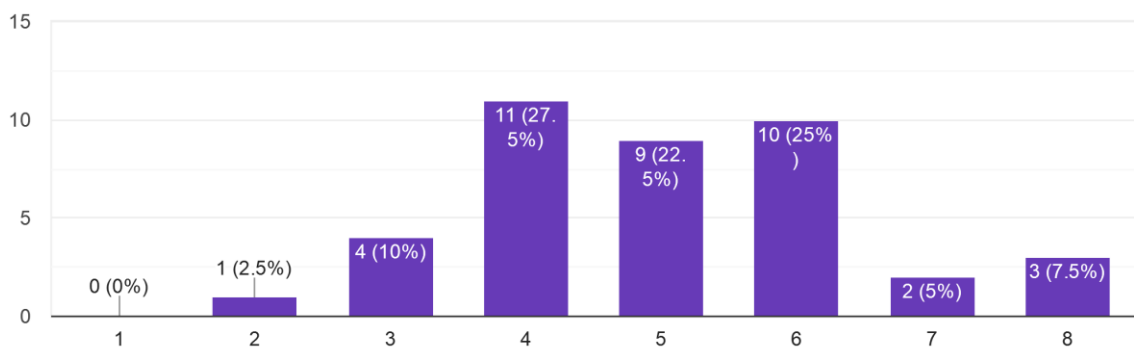


Would you have liked more or less of the following?



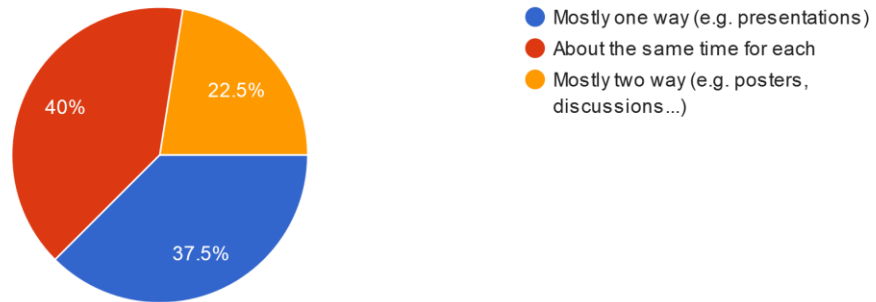
What is for you the ideal daily length for this kind of online workshop (in hours)?
